Conventionally the economic theories do not take into consideration the ecological aspects of any economy. That is why probably, development experiences of any region do not follow the rules which are already predicted in hardcore economic theories. For many reasons north east India maintained a separate identity from other parts of India. Among those reasons ecological constraint is important one. The readers after reading this book will have two impressions. Firstly, they will have an idea about the development pattern of north east India since 1980. Secondly the readers will know how ecological constraints of north east India have induced this region to violate the so called universally accepted rules of economic transition.

Dr. Subhabrata Chakrabarti (M.A; M.Phil; Ph.D) has been teaching Economics for about twenty years in different colleges of West Bengal and Sikkim. Presently he is working as Assistant professor; Department of Economics; Kharagpur College; West Bengal. He has published at least twenty research papers in different standard journals and edited books.
