Political culture is always influenced by ethnic group loyalties. A.R. Ball is of the view that not language but religion was used by the Irish people to stress their separateness from the British in the long struggle for independence before 1922. He is also of the view that instability in the political system caused by ethnic group loyalties being directed to themselves and not to national government in cases of allegiance are directed towards another state.
